



Some "Martin" Points

The "Martin" shows the first real progress of note in ice skate construction for a generation. How the old fashioned strap skates were replaced by the key and heel-plate variety, and they in turn by the "levers," will be remembered by many. It was discovered in time, however, that lever skates were decidedly unreliable, with the result that they were largely abandoned and the wheels of progress turned backward; in other words, the public, in order to get a skate that would more nearly conform to the shape of the shoe, would not bend down out of position at the clamp extremities and would stay on, returned to the discarded key and heel-plate skates of ancient history. It was generally acknowledged nevertheless, that the "lever" was really the ideal form of attachment if its faults could be overcome. This has been accomplished in the "Martin" as a moment's investigation will show, and as amply proven by the enormous demand for our skates.

The "Martin" is built on entirely new lines with the toe and heel-plates eliminated, which enables us to form our toe-clamps to the natural shape of the shoe, and have same come in direct contact with the sole throughout its entire width, and overlap the upper edges of same in every instance. The heel-clamp likewise grips the heel firmly and positively, even though it may be badly worn down at the side. The "Martin" heel-support is adjustable at both the front and rear—a feature not found in any other clamp

skate—so that a heel of any size or shape may be accommodated; consequently our skate will fit any and all styles of shoes, and will stay on under absolutely all conditions. The sole and heel-clamps are braced by supports on the under side in such a manner that they cannot be bent downward out of position, and the skate may always, therefore, be instantly placed in the proper clamping position both at the toe and heel, with but one hand.


The lever on the "Martin" is supported firmly on the blade, and cannot sag or be forced out of position, as so common with the old style lever construction. In fact, with the exception of the adjusting nut, every part of the skate is supported directly on the blade. The "Martin" blade with the upper bar bracing and stiffening the runner part, is a marvel for strength and lightness, and the complete skate is much lighter and stronger than any other lever skate made. "Martin" skates are made in several grades from the very best of selected skate stock, and the workmanship and finish are of the highest order and in keeping with the material.

When not in use, the "Martin" may be folded to occupy a space measuring one-half inch in width at the top, and about one-quarter inch or less at the bottom, so that a pair in a wallet may be carried in the breast pocket or a lady's muff. What nicer Xmas present can be imagined for a man, woman or child than a pair of "Martin" skates in a neat wallet; what nicer for one's self to take along in the pocket on an outing, or to the office on the chance of an hour's skating at an opportune moment?

ADJUSTMENT OF "MARTIN" SKATES

Prepare to attach by first opening lever, then turn too and heel-clamps to cross the blade.

Next set heel-stop in notch nearest the heel-clamp, that the size of your heel will permit. (To re-set heel-stop, press top end of same toward rear of skate and downward, out of the old notch, slide along to the desired new notch, press well up into same, and then push top end of stop forward until it again rests firmly on the blade.) Do not have the space to receive the heel any larger than your heel requires.

Now place shoe in position on the skate, with heel pressed forward against the heel-stop, and regulate adjusting nut so that skate will be securely clamped on when lever is closed. To remove the skate, start the lever by pushing through from opposite side of blade, (it will be found projecting there for this purpose,) then grasp the handle and open. Pulling the heel-clamp back away from the heel will now cause skate to immediately leave the shoe.
